Monthly Fund Update / August 2022

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Germany, Luxembourg, and the UK

The BBH Lux Income Fund Class A ("the Fund") returned -2.40% in August, and the Bloomberg US Aggregate Index returned -2.83%.

Treasury rates rose during the month. Federal Reserve ("the Fed") Chairman Jay Powell stated at the economic policy symposium in Jackson Hole, WY that the Fed is committed to restoring price stability through more restrictive monetary policy. Market expectations revealed the increasing probability of a more-aggressive, hawkish action following these remarks. The Fed continued to reduce the size of its balance sheet, and the pace will accelerate to a maximum monthly decrease of \$95 billion per month starting in September. In addition to monetary policies, fiscal policies were passed in August that will impact the economy in a variety of ways. The Inflation Reduction Act and the Student Loan Forgiveness plans will impact certain credits both positively and negatively, although we do not hold any significantly impacted credits, such as student loan asset-backed securities (ABS). Nor have we observed significant changes to credits owned in the Fund.

Agency mortgage-backed securities (MBS) underperformed Treasury alternatives as mortgage spreads widened, perhaps due in part to the Fed's waning purchases. The corporate bond market outperformed Treasuries as credit spreads declined during the month.

The Fund's outperformance was driven by its overweight position in corporate bonds, favorable selection results from positions in business development companies (BDCs), and property and casualty (P&C) insurance bonds. The avoidance of MBS contributed to its outperformance, as mortgages were down significantly during the month.

Credit valuations remain attractive and offer more opportunities to find durable credits¹ at attractive yields. We remain measured, selective, and patient in evaluating these emerging opportunities.

¹ Obligations such as bonds, notes, loans, leases, and other forms of indebtedness, except for cash and cash equivalents, issued by obligors other than the U.S. Government and its agencies, totaled at the level of the ultimate obligor or guarantor of the Obligation. Durable means the ability to withstand a wide variety of economic conditions.

Effective duration is a measure of the portfolio's return sensitivity to changes in interest rates.

The Fund is actively managed. Under normal circumstances, the fund is managed with the intention of maintaining an effective duration of between 80%-120% of the effective duration of Bloomberg US Aggregate Index.

Weighted Average Life of securities excludes US Treasury futures positions.

Yield to Maturity is the rate of return the portfolio would achieve if all purchased bonds and derivatives were held to maturity, assuming all coupon and principal payments are received as scheduled and reinvested at the same yield to maturity. This figure is subject to change and is not meant to represent the yield earned by any particular security. Yield to Maturity is before fees and expenses.

The Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Index covers the USD-denominated, investment-grade (rated Baa3 or above by Moody's), fixed-rate, and taxable areas of the bond market. This is the broadest measure of the taxable U.S. bond market, including most Treasury, agency, corporate, mortgage-backed, asset-backed, and international dollar-denominated issues, all with maturities of 1 year or more. Investments cannot be made in an index.
